GRAYSON CRYPT RESTORATION AND DEDICATION

The burial site of brothers William (1740-1790) and Spence Grayson (1737-1798), located on the grounds of the former Belle Aire Plantation

in Prince William County, Virginia, was rededicated February 7, 2015 to complete a final initiative of outgoing VASSAR President Bill Broadus.

The new headstones were placed on November 15, 2014. President Broadus was unable to attend the February event and was represented by VASSAR 3rd Vice President Mike Elston.

ANNUAL MEETING

Fairfax Resolves was designated the 2014 Best Very Large Chapter in Virginia at the 2015 Annual Meeting of the Virginia Society, Sons of the American Revolution (VASSAR). The Chapter delegation attending the meeting (in Richmond February 20-22, 2015) was led by 3rd Vice President Bud Walker. A separate description and status of each award and our status in remaining 2015 National competitions are provided below:

Law Enforcement Officer of the Year. Sergeant Mark Dale, one of our 2014 Law Enforcement Commendation Medal recipients, was designated the VASSAR Law Enforcement Officer of the Year. Sergeant Dale personally helped to establish the "Officer-Involved Shooting Group" within the Peer Support Section of the Fairfax County Police Department. He is recognized within the Northern Virginia area for his work in this field, and has been a featured lecturer at the FBI Academy in Quantico, Virginia. Sergeant Dale is also active with the Police Unity Tour and the Concerns of Police Survivors, all to help bring

awareness to the families of fallen officers. We will present Sergeant Dale his Virginia Award at the annual Fairfax County awards ceremony in June 2015.

Teacher of the Year. Our Chapter winner (Mrs. Barbara Ruff, McLean High School) was selected as the 2014 VASSAR Teacher of the Year. This marks the second year in a row that Fairfax Resolves has nominated the VASSAR Teacher of the Year. The VASSAR Teacher of the Year Program was originally established in 1986, where chapters recognize one or more local teachers and submits them as candidates for the VASSAR Teacher of the Year. As sponsor of the VASSAR Teacher of the Year, Fairfax Resolves also received the 2014 Chester E. May Award.

Knight Essay Contest. Our 2014 Chapter winner, Miss Sierra Chen, also won the VASSAR Knight Essay competition. Sierra is now eligible to compete in the National Knight Essay competition this summer at the SAR National Congress. The Virginia Society first participated in The George S. and Stella M. Knight Essay Contest in 1996.

Rumbaugh Historical Patriotic Orations Contest. Our Chapter winner, Miss Virginia Sun, finished 3rd in the VASSAR Rumbaugh Orations Contest on February 21st. The first SAR-sponsored orations contest was held in Cincinnati, Ohio in 1945.

Flag Certificate Program. The Virginia Society asks all Chapters to award at least one SAR Flag Certificate during each calendar year. All Virginia chapters (we presented five!) met the requirements for the VASSAR Flag Certificate Program in 2014 and received an award streamer. Due in part to the continued support of the Flag Certificate Program by Fairfax Resolves, Virginia again will be eligible for the

Admiral William R. Furlong Memorial Award at the 2015 National Congress.

History Day Support. Fairfax Resolves received a VASSAR award streamer for our support of the District 5 National History Day (NHD) competition on March 1, 2014. The 2015 District 5 NHD competition was held March 7, 2015. Fairfax Resolves was represented by Compatriot Jeff Thomas.

Revolutionary Grave Registrations and Markings. Fairfax Resolves was one of only three Chapters recognized for grave registrations and markings in 2014. Our 2014 marking was conducted on October 25, 2014 in Amissville, Virginia.

FAIRFAX RESOLVES WELCOMES NSSAR GENEALOGIST GENERAL

The guest speaker at our March 2015 meeting was our Genealogist General John Sinks. His topic was "Revolutionary Taxes as Evidence of Patriotic Service."

The Continental Congress had no authority to levy taxes, and so the burden fell to the colonies. Congress requested resources from the colonies to carry on the war. Taxes assessed to address a request of the Congress or that

specifically were passed to "support the war or achieve Independence" qualify as Patriotic Service. "Taxpayers typically participated in the assessment process" Sinks noted. "Those not co-operating in the assessment process were penalized, often double or triple taxed."

Sinks encouraged Virginia Compatriots seeking evidence of Patriotic Service to check existing tax rolls for these tax records are State Records, and have been preserved in Richmond. "If you are seeking evidence for an ancestor that lived in one of the 'burned' counties, you may find your evidence here."

R.I.P. WILLIAM E. YOUNGS

Compatriot William Ellis Youngs passed peacefully on March 15, 2015. In addition to being a member of SAR and Fairfax Resolves, he was also a lifetime member of International Alliance of Theatrical Stage Employees (IATSE). Funeral services were held March 18, 2015 at National Funeral Home in Falls Church, Virginia. Interment followed at National Memorial Park.

A native of the DC Area (since age 4), Bill contemplated entering the clergy following his High School graduation but he "didn't think I could influence people enough". He then turned to another influential industry —motion pictures. He was patriotically inspired through his work on educational motion pictures that he showed to area embassies and government offices while employed by the Washington Motion Picture Company.

After serving the 2nd Infantry Division Headquarters during WWII, for two years including the invasion of Normandy, Bill declined an extension in the service as a Chaplain's Assistant. At the 2009 Chapter Awards Banquet, Bill said that "God is getting me back for turning that down by making me the Chaplain Emeritus for Fairfax Resolves".


Once stateside, he launched into a 30 year film industry career with the U.S. Information Agency under the Department of State. Upon his retirement, he "substituted" for someone at the Motion Picture Association and walked out the door 15 years later. He became active in his community through the University Film and Video Association and the Society of Motion Picture Engineers.

His service to Veterans includes being a past president of the 2nd Div. Indian Head Association, and as such, he led National Memorial Services on Veterans Day at the flaming sword monument on Constitution Avenue. He continues this service to veterans as the co-organizer of Veterans Common, where he helps to conduct multiple services per year.

Bill's SAR communication and leadership activities include: joining Fairfax Resolves in 1984 and holding every office but Secretary/Treasurer, creating the Defender newsletter and including historic articles in every issue, mentoring many Compatriots and contributing great patience, advice, counsel and encouragement, serving for over ten years as

DAR Liaison for the Virginia Society, and spending countless hours, with his wife Mary Helen, demonstrating SAR support for all levels of Children of the American Revolution (CAR) and the Daughters of the American Revolution (DAR).

He was honored with an emeritus position in our Chapter for his "outstanding leadership and mentoring Compatriots as those Compatriots inspire and educate the Community in the principle objectives of the SAR." All of Fairfax Resolves give you our respectful salute in acknowledgement of your memory of your service, your presence, and your advice.
