I'll clue you in on the history of streamers, awards etc. and when Fairfax Resolves first started collecting award recognition that these bring. In addition I will give you a listing of what we have gathered so far (sort of an inventory of our flag). The colors have been revamped and our own Dr. Sinks chose them as Chairman of the State Awards Committee. But first, as shown below we have 6 new streamer awards that have already been placed on our flag and they are top to bottom:



<u>History Day Support</u>---As members of Fairfax Resolves we dedicated monetary (\$100 or more) support and/or volunteered as judges for this valuable learning tool available to children in our Region's Schools.

<u>"And the World Turned Upside Down"</u>-Yorktown, 1781-2006---this streamer is for Fairfax Resolves involvement in the 225<sup>th</sup> Yorktown Day observance in October.

<u>Chapter Excellence Award</u>---this streamer is awarded for Fairfax Resolves achieving an excellent rating in at least 13 categories...total categories were 17 this year.

Forgotten Patriots 2006-2007 with an additional Star—this streamer is for Fairfax Resolves participation in a Presidential Program that is continuing this year. If you submit one Patriot that has not been included in any DAR, SAR, C.A.R. database of ancestors and they are Virginian, then you receive a streamer and the second one is rewarded with a star. Thanks John Sinks for getting us going in this important endeavor.

<u>Oration Contest 2003-2006</u>---this streamer is recognition for our Chapter's holding a Speech contest for 3 straight years and had an entrant in the State-wide Oration contest held each February in Richmond.

**Revolutionary Grave Registration**---Awarded to the Chapter who has successfully registered 5 Revolutionary War Graves in the past year.
