<u>Personal Information on</u> <u>Our President</u>



Tom was born in Shelbyville, Tennessee but spent the first 10 years of his life as a military brat. He graduated from the University of Tennessee with a B.S. in mathematics in 1969 and obtained a Master of Science in International Relations in 1980. Upon graduation from the University of Tennessee, Tom received a commission as a second lieutenant in the Air Force.

His Air Force career spanned more than 29 years, approximately 17 years of that stationed overseas with assignments in Thailand, Spain, Italy, and Germany. During his career Tom served in a variety of assignments including as a pilot and instructor pilot in the T-38, OV-10, F-4, and F-16. Other assignments include command at both the squadron and wing level. He is a graduate of Air Command and Staff College, the Defense Language Institute, and National War College. Tom retired from the Air Force in 1998.

Tom next joined Science Applications International Corporation. During his current career with SAIC, Tom has managed programs providing support to the Air Staff, Office of the Secretary of Defense, Defense Threat Reduction Agency, and the Coalition Provisional Authority in Iraq.

Tom realized a long time ambition in May 2005 when he was admitted to the SAR. In the two years since joining the Fairfax Resolves Chapter, he has served as 1st Vice President and is currently serving as Chapter President. Tom is also a member of the Sons of Union Veterans of the Civil War and a life member of the Daedalians, the national fraternity of military pilots.

Washington's Resignation Speech

At the Mid-Atlantic Conference we had the opportunity to see an original document which is stored at Annapolis, MD State Archives. This document is <u>Washington's</u> <u>Resignation Speech (Final Draft)</u>. <u>Annapolis</u>, <u>December 23</u>, <u>1783</u>. the stike through's <u>are</u> as the General had placed them in his revisions. It was quite an emotional event and the timing allowed General Washington to carry out a promise to Martha to be home for Christmas for the first time in eight years.

Mr. President,

The great events on which my resignation depended, having at length taken place, I have now the honor of Offering my sincere congratulations to Congress, and Presenting myself before (Congress) them, to surrender Into their hands the trust committed to me, and to claim the indulgence of retiring (request permission to retire) from the service to my country.

Happy in the confirmation of our independence and sovereignty, and pleased with the opportunity afforded the United States, of becoming a respectable Nation (as well as in the contemplation of our prospect of National Happiness), I resign with satisfaction the appointment I accepted with diffidence—a diffident in my abilities To accomplish so arduous a task, which however was superseded by a confidence in the rectitude of our Cause, the support of the Supreme Power of the Unon, and the patronage of Heaven.

The successful termination of the War has verified the most sanguine expectations—and my gratitude for the Interposition of Providence, and the assisstance I have received from by Countrymen, increases with every Review of the momentous Contest.

While I repeat my obligations to the army in general, I should do injustice to my own feelings not to Acknnowledge in this place the peculiar services and distinguished merits of the Gentlemen who have been attached to my person during the war. It was impossible the choice of confidential officers to compose my family should have been more fortunate. Permit me Sir, to recommend in particular those, who have continued in service to the present moment, as worthy and favorable notice and patronage of Congress.

I consider it an indispensable duty to close this last solemn act of my official life, by commending the Interests of our dearest Country to the protection of Almighty God, and those who have the superintendance (direction) of them, to his holy keeping.

Having now finished the work assigned me, I retire from the great theatre of action,-and bidding an affectionate (a final) farewell this August body, under whose orders I have so long acted, I here offer (today delivered) my Commission, and take my (ultimate) leave of all the employments of public life.
