The *Fairfax Resolves*

The *Fairfax Resolves*, written by George Mason, were approved by the citizens of Fairfax County weeks before the battle of Point Pleasant, October 1774, months before the battles of Lexington and Concord, and almost two years before the Declaration

of Independence was signed. These resolves identified American rights as citizens under the British Constitution, with grievances, proposed means to force a redress of grievances, reaffirmed loyalty to the King, and made implied threats of other measures if the Sovereign did not help to reduce the colonial state of desperation. The ideas of freedom, liberty, the rights of man and constitutional rights were themes that was to be found again in the Virginia Bill of Rights, the Virginia Constitution, and the Declaration of Independence.
